

DCOC/JA ACHIEVEMENTS


In June 2018, the Signatory States to the Djibouti Code of Conduct (DCoC) gathered at the International Maritime Organization (IMO) headquarters in London. This meeting aimed to follow up on the recommendations put forth during the High-Level meeting on the implementation of the Jeddah Amendment to the Djibouti Code of Conduct, which took place from 7th to 9th May 2018 in Saudi Arabia. The meeting agreed on key priorities for implementing the revised Code, which included enhancing maritime security governance, strengthening the regional information-sharing network and better coordination of capacitybuilding efforts.



Working Group 1 on Information Sharing has made significant strides by developing the Information Sharing Network [Strategy & Roadmap](#). This strategy encourages Signatory states to establish multi-agency NMISCs and has led to the development of the DCoC/JA [website](#) as a key conduit for information sharing.




Figure 1. Proposed structural changes under WG 2

[Standard Operating Procedures](#) have been developed for the DCoC Information Sharing Network (ISN), which connects the National Centers to the Regional Centers. A proposal to expand the structure of Working Group 2 on Capacity Building to include sub-working groups (see Fig.1) dedicated to the seven DCoC/JA thematic areas has been made and will be discussed and approved at the 2023 South Africa High-Level Meeting.

Working Group 2 on Capacity Building has devised the Capacity Building Matrix on a Members Only portal to capture needs and priorities effectively for coordinated support by implementing partners. Regional States have actively participated in like-minded initiatives such as CUTLASS EXPRESS, SHADE, CMF, CGIMA, where DCoC has received recognition for its role in capacity-building coordination



DCoCJA Organizational Structure
